



Why have a Youth Congress?

- ◇ Youth leaders, chaplains, priests asked what provision there was for young people at the Eucharistic Congress?
- ◇ It will offer an age appropriate participation for young adults as has been the custom at Eucharistic Congresses in other parts of the world.

- ◇ In this year of the Synod on “Youth, Faith and Vocation Discernment,” it is a great opportunity to involve young people in the national gathering.
- ◇ It gives a unique opportunity for youth delegates to focus on Eucharistic catechesis and prayer.
- ◇ The cost for the main Congress was prohibitive for many young people, schools and parish youth groups.

Congress Aims:

- ◇ To give young people a positive experience of being a young Catholic today.
- ◇ To help young people experience how God speaks to them through the celebration of the Eucharist.
- ◇ To help enable young people to live the Eucharist through witness, proclamation, care for the broken in society and love for the planet.
