### Gospel: John 21:20-25

## MONDAY

### Ss Charles Lwanga, and Companions, Martyrs

*These twenty-two martyrs were among many newly baptized Catholics and Anglicans who were killed for their faith and virtue in Uganda between 1885 and 1887 by a debauched and brutal ruler. They are remembered for the heroic calm of their fidelity to Christ.*

#### Entrance Antiphon:

As gold in the furnace, the Lord put his chosen to the test; as sacrificial offerings, he took them to himself; and in due time they will be honoured, and grace and peace will be with the elect of God.

#### First Reading: Acts 19: 1-8

*Did you receive the Holy Spirit when you became believers?*

#### Responsorial Psalm:

Kingdoms of the earth, sing to God.

#### Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, Alleluia! I came from the Father and have come into the world, and now I leave the world to go to the Father. Alleluia!

#### Gospel: John 16: 29-33

*Be brave: I have conquered the world.*

#### Communion Antiphon:

How precious in the eyes of the Lord is the death of his holy ones.

## TUESDAY

### Weekday

Entrance Antiphon:

I am the first and the last, I was dead and am now alive. Behold, I am alive for ever and ever, alleluia.

First Reading: Acts 20: 17-27

*I am finishing my race and carrying out the mission the Lord Jesus gave me.*

Responsorial Psalm:

Kingdoms of the earth, sing to God.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, Alleluia! I will not leave you orphans, says the Lord; I go, but I will come back to you, and your hearts will be full of joy. Alleluia!

Gospel: John 17: 1-11

*Father, it is time for you to glorify me.*

Communion Antiphon:

The Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you all things and remind you of all I have told you, says the Lord, alleluia.

## WEDNESDAY

### St Boniface, Bishop and Martyr

*Born in Devon about 675, Boniface was killed in the Netherlands in 754. As a monk and teacher, Boniface went to evangelize the Germanic peoples. Boniface is remembered as a determined missionary and as a church organiser and reformer whose work shaped the future of Europe. He is buried at his abbey of Fulda and is honoured as Apostle of Germany.*

Entrance Antiphon:

This Saint went as far as death, handing over his life to destruction for the work of Christ, alleluia.

First Reading: Acts 20: 28-38

*I commend you to God, who has power to build you up and to give you your inheritance.*

Responsorial Psalm:

Kingdoms of the earth, sing to God.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, Alleluia! Go, make disciples of all the nations: I am with you always; yes, to the end of time. Alleluia!

Gospel: John 17: 11-19

*May they be one like us.*

Communion Antiphon:

Whoever loses his life for the sake of the Gospel will save it, says the Lord, alleluia.

## THURSDAY

### St Norbert, Bishop

*Born in the Rhineland about 1080, Norbert died at Magdeburg in 1134. A cleric in minor orders, he converted from a comfortable life in 1115, was ordained a presbyter and took up a life of poverty. He is remembered for his zealous reform of clerical life and for the example of his attachment to the values of the gospel.*

Entrance Antiphon:

With boldness let us approach the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace as a timely help, alleluia.

First Reading: Acts 22: 30, 23: 6-11

*Now you must bear witness in Rome.*

Responsorial Psalm:

Preserve me, Lord, I take refuge in you.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, Alleluia! I will send you the Spirit of truth, says the Lord; he will lead you to the compete truth. Alleluia!

Gospel: John 17:20-26

*May they be completely one.*

Communion Antiphon:

I tell you the truth, it is for your good that I go; for if I do not go away, the paraclete will not come to you, says the Lord, alleluia.

## FRIDAY

### Weekday

Entrance Antiphon:

Christ loved us and washed us clean of our sins by his Blood, and made us into a kingdom, priests for his God and Father, alleluia.

First Reading: Acts 25: 13-21

*I ordered Paul to be remanded until I could send him to Caesar.*

Responsorial Psalm:

The Lord has set his sway in heaven.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, Alleluia! The Holy Spirit will teach you everything and remind you of all I have said to you. Alleluia!

Gospel: John 21: 15-19

*Feed my lambs, feed my sheep.*

Communion Antiphon:

When the Spirit of truth comes, he will teach you all truth, says the Lord, alleluia.
