


The course will benefit everyone who wants a deeper connection between their faith and their daily lives.

It is a course to help you discover more energising and empowering ways to live out your faith in the reality of today's world: through relationships in family, parish, workplace; and the events of daily life.

It aims to help you become more open, confident, trusting and willing to work for change.

Faith for Life is experienced in a journey of four movements which will help participants to explore and deepen the call received in Baptism.

Each of the four Movements requires:

12 hours of group activities, including facilitated conversations, input, personal and group reflection, prayer and liturgy.

2 or 3 meetings in core groups arranged between each Movement.

A short written summary of the participants' new insights and learning.

CHURCH IN AND FOR THE WORLD




This Movement gives opportunities for:

- Accessing Scripture in an adult way.
- Reflecting on Story in Scripture.

- Taking up the challenge to live the Gospel.
