## **MONDAY**

### **Weekday**

Entrance Antiphon:

Your merciful love, O God, we have received in the midst of your temple. Your praise, O God, like your name, reaches the ends of the earth; your right hand is filled with saving justice.

First Reading: Genesis 28: 10-22

*He saw a ladder standing there, and there were angels of God going up to it and coming down, and God was speaking.*

Responsorial Psalm:

My God, in you I trust.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, Alleluia! Your words are spirit, Lord, and they are life: you have the message of eternal life. Alleluia!

Gospel: Matthew 9: 18-26

*My daughter has just died, but come and her life will be saved.*

Communion Antiphon:

Taste and see that the Lord is good; blessed the man who seeks refuge in him.

## TUESDAY

### *St Augustine Zhao Rong and Companions*

*All these men were Chinese martyrs who died between 1648 and 1930. Augustine was a soldier who was influenced by Monsignor Dufresse and became a Christian then later a priest. He was cruelly tortured and died in 1815.*

Entrance Antiphon:

Your merciful love, O God, we have received in the midst of your temple. Your praise, O God, like your name, reaches the ends of the earth; your right hand is filled with saving justice.

First Reading: Genesis 32: 23-33

*Your name shall be Israel, because you have been strong against God.*

Responsorial Psalm:

Lord, in my justice I shall see your face.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, Alleluia! May the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ enlighten the eyes of our mind, so that we can see what hope his call holds for us. Alleluia!

Gospel: Matthew 9: 32-38

*The harvest is rich but the labourers are few.*

Communion Antiphon:

Taste and see that the Lord is good; blessed the man who seeks refuge in him.

## WEDNESDAY

### Weekday

Entrance Antiphon:

Your merciful love, O God, we have received in the midst of your temple. Your praise, O God, like your name, reaches the ends of the earth; your right hand is filled with saving justice.

First Reading: Genesis 41: 55-57; 42: 5-7, 17-24

*Truly we are being called to account for our brother.*

Responsorial Psalm:

May your love be upon us, O Lord, as we place all our hope in you.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, Alleluia! By his own choice the Father makes us his children by the message of the truth, so that we should be a sort of first-fruits of all that he created. Alleluia!

Gospel: Matthew 10: 1-7

*Go to the lost sheep of the house of Israel.*

Communion Antiphon:

Taste and see that the Lord is good; blessed the man who seeks refuge in him.

## THURSDAY

### ST BENEDICT, ABBOT PATRON OF EUROPE

*Born at Norcia (Italy) about 480, Benedict died at Monte Cassino about 547. After studies in Rome he became a hermit at Subiaco, where many sought his counsel. He then founded the monastery at Monte Casino. Benedict is remembered for his widely influential monastic rule, combining work and prayer, and for his charity and moderation. Since 1964 he has been honoured as patron of Europe, a title shared since 1980 with Saint Cyril and Saint Methodius.*

Entrance Antiphon:

There was a man of venerable life, Benedict, blessed by grace and by name, who, leaving home and patrimony and desiring to please God alone, sought out the habit of holy living.

First Reading: Proverbs 2: 1-9

*Apply your heart to truth.*

Responsorial Psalm:

I will bless the Lord at all times.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, Alleluia! How happy are the poor in spirit; theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Alleluia!

Gospel: Matthew 19: 27-29

*You who have followed me will be repaid a hundred times over.*

Communion Antiphon:

This is the steward, faithful and prudent, whom the Lord set over his household to give them their allowance of food at the proper time.

## FRIDAY

### Weekday

Entrance Antiphon:

First Reading: Genesis 46: 1-7, 28-30

*I can die, now that I have seen you.*

Responsorial Psalm:

The salvation of the just comes from the Lord.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, Alleluia! The word of the Lord remains for ever: What is this word? It is the Good News that has been brought to you. Alleluia!
